\*I come from Sao Paulo, a Brazilian metropolis. A city with about 12 million inhabitants and with so many skyscrapers where I could see a little 'the sky is a' not an easy undertaking! I moved to Genestrerio in February 2008. A country in Mendrisio with about 900 inhabitants. It might seem that here there is none, but there are 180 degrees of sky and a lot of good people!

In 2009 I was watching one of my notebooks where I write my notes, sketches of designs and paste I reflect on my work. Leafing through one of the books I found a drawing I made in 1989 and decided to return it on canvas. I added other elements to the original when I realized that on the canvas, represented, there was a flower that I see during my daily walks in Genestrerio. From there I knew I wanted to share some 'of this new feeling of being able to watch the sky at 180 degrees, to live in the blue. The first part talks about these walks, the discovery of new forms of flowers that grow wild in fields and even those grown in the gardens. Every so often you meet someone, you greet and talk a bit '. Turned the forms and turn in my mind. In Mendrisio came the world cycling and now the flowers have turned into bicycle wheels. So, I became interested more and more to the contrasts between the blue and red houses, yellow, pink and orange that you see in the country. It is a game of infinite possibilities of shapes and colors to be combined.
